Post-doctoral Fellowship position – Shipping economics and analytics

The Center for Applied Research (SNF) at the Norwegian School of Economics (NHH) invites applicants for a two-year Post-doctoral Fellowship within the field of shipping economics and analytics. The position is part of the Centre for Shipping and Logistics at SNF/NHH and offers the candidate the opportunity to conduct research within one or more of the following areas: Commercial management in bulk shipping, Digitalization and maritime big data, Smart contracts and blockchain applications in shipping, and Contractual barriers to operational efficiency. There are no teaching or administrative duties. The position is an excellent opportunity to develop your research portfolio within one of the leading research groups in the area.

Qualified candidates should have strong analytical skills and a PhD degree in a relevant discipline including economics, computing, or logistics engineering. Previous knowledge and experience relevant to the position, such as programming, advanced econometrics, machine learning and/or international shipping is appreciated. Candidates will be evaluated on the quality and relevance of their previous education and experience. The Post-Doctoral research is carried out in English and therefore English language proficiency should be demonstrated either by test results or published research, if the applicant is a non-native English speaker.

The annual salary for the Post-doctoral Fellowship position is set according to the Norwegian State Salary, and currently pays 662,378 NOK gross (equivalent to approximately € 64,500 or USD 72,000). The salary ensures a fair standard of living in Norway, and is subject to Norwegian taxes and benefits, including health care provision.

The city of Bergen offers a mild coastal climate and hosts rich opportunities for culture and outdoor activities, as well as a family-friendly environment.

The postdoctoral fellow is expected to start in Q1 2020 (the earliest start date is January 1). The application should be submitted online and contain details of the applicant's scientific education and work experience (CV with complete list of publications, diplomas and English transcripts), a maximum of 5 published or unpublished research papers and a one-page research statement.
